BAYLOR UNIVERSITY

More than 150 years ago Baylor University's Baptist founders sought to establish an institution of higher learning dedicated to Christian principles, superior academics and a shared sense of community. Today the University's motto -- Pro Ecclesia, Pro Texana (for church, for state) -- remains the foundation of its mission.

Baylor University, chartered in 1845 by the Republic of Texas through the efforts of Baptist pioneers, is the oldest institution of higher learning in the state, is affiliated with the Baptist General Convention of Texas and is the largest Baptist university in the world.

While remaining true to its heritage, Baylor has grown to more than 13,700 students, and its nationally recognized academic divisions provide 158 baccalaureate degree programs at the undergraduate level. The University also offers 23 master's degrees with 65 programs of study, one educational specialist and 15 doctoral degree programs through the Graduate School plus the juris doctor through the Law School and the master of divinity, master of divinity/master of music, master of divinity/master of social work and doctor of ministry through George W. Truett Theological Seminary.

Baylor consistently attracts high-quality students. It ranks among the nation's top 1 percent in the number of freshman National Merit Scholars enrolled, and is one of eight Texas colleges or universities and one of only 261 institutions in the country with a Phi Beta Kappa chapter.

Committed unalterably to character and leadership development with a service orientation, the University encourages students to become involved in one or more of the 260 student organizations on campus.

Exemplifying Baylor's commitment to lead the way in both learning and living, the University's alumni serve as ministers and judges, doctors and teachers, artists and business leaders, and populate many other professions.

It is our people - students, faculty, staff, alumni and friends - who comprise the heart and soul of the institution. The individuals who make up the Baylor family share a common commitment to supporting a community where faith, learning, scholarship and service to others are pursued with equal vigor.

BAYLOR DEBATE

Debate at Baylor University began as part of the weekly meetings of the Philomathesian Literary society in 1850, spilled over to intercollegiate competition when Baylor challenged the University of Texas to a debate in 1893 under the sponsorship of Baylor's Lone Star School of Oratory, took a shot in the arm in 1905 when the Baylor Oratorical Association assumed control, and really took off in 1923 when Baylor took over the activity as a university-sponsored program.

Baylor University, chartered under the Republic of Texas on February 1, 1845, opened with twenty four students and one teacher in the preparatory department on May 18, 1846, enrolled its first collegiate students in June 1847, and reported its first collegiate students in June 1847, and reported enrollments of about one hundred students by January 1848. forensic activities were stressed almost from the beginning. Baylor's first annual catalogue, published in 1851, gives the first record of debates among Baylor students held at the regular weekly meeting of the Philomathesian Literary Society. By 1854, four rival societies had been organized.

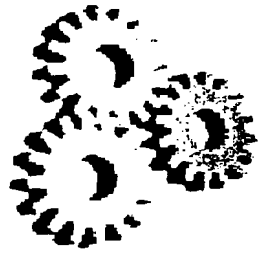
The first intercollegiate debate in Baylor's history was held in 1893 with the University of Texas. The best Philomathesian Society debater (a young man who was later to become Governor of Texas and President of Baylor University) and the best Erisophian Society debater (who later served as United States Senator from Texas for thirty years) joined forces for this debate which created such intense interest among Baylor students that they chartered a special train to Austin, Texas, to support their team. The next year over 5000 people turned out for the return engagement held in the old Cotton Palace in Waco.

The long history of forensics at Baylor as a university sponsored activity differs greatly in organization and administration from the period as a student-sponsored activity, but the primary purpose remains the same-to provide a worthwhile activity whereby students can band themselves together outside their regular classes to further their education. The competitive nature of the program motivates students to develop themselves intellectually and to sharpen their reasoning ability and communication skills. It also provides an opportunity for travel, for association with bright students from other universities, and for social enjoyment.

Many ex-debaters can also be counted among Baylor's most distinguished alumni. For example, four of Baylor's presidents were Baylor debaters; namely, Samuel Palmer Brooks, Pat M. Neff, William R. White, and Abner V. McCall. At least three highly revered present or recent Baylor faculty members were debaters -Professors Matthew Dawson in the law school, Dr. Calvin Kent in the business school, and Dr. Robert Baird in the philosophy department. Former U.S. Senator Tom Connally and former Texas Governor Pat Neff represented Baylor in its first intercollegiate debate in 1893. In 1921, former U.S. Congressman W.R. Poage participated in Baylor's first debate tour. Later outstanding attorneys Phil Teeling and Frank Guittard represented the University and won first place in the first tournament in which Baylor participated in 1929. Price Daniel, former governor of Texas and United States Senator, won several honors in forensics for Baylor in the latter 1920's as did Thomas C. Mann, Ambassador to Mexico, William Boswell and Frank Wilson, Waco attorneys and Baylor law professors. Former Texas Governor Ann Richards also won many honors as a Baylor debater.

- ❖ Provide a continuous system of mentoring, advising, counseling, and tutoring for students in the Waco ISD and their parents.
- ❖ Offer students and their parents information about the opportunities and advantages of post-secondary education.
- ❖ Ensure all students access to rigorous courses that prepare them for college.
- ❖ Organize activities to foster parental involvement in preparing students for college.
- ❖ Increase the achievement and performance of **GEAR UP Waco** students in middle and high schools, the number of students who pursue advanced and enrichments courses, the number of students who pass the state exam, and the number of students who continue their education beyond high school.
- ❖ Disseminate the curriculum, programs, and models to other schools and projects that are interested in increasing the post-secondary involvement of at-risk students.

1. Competition Rooms

Rounds One and Two will be held in the following buildings: The Bill Daniel Student Center, The Castellaw Communication Center, Draper hall, Carroll Science Building, Marms McLean Gymnasium, the Student Life Complex, and the Baylor Law School. Rounds Three through Eight will be held in the Cashion Building, part of the Hankamer School of Business. At the conclusion of round Two, all competitors should move directly to Cashion. Transportation assistance will be available. Evidence storage each night will be in the Cashion classrooms. Elimination rounds on Monday will be held in the Waco Convention Center, attached to the Hilton. All evidence should be moved out of Cashion Hall on Sunday evening.

Team photographs will be taken Saturday between rounds. Please proceed in a timely fashion at your designated time.

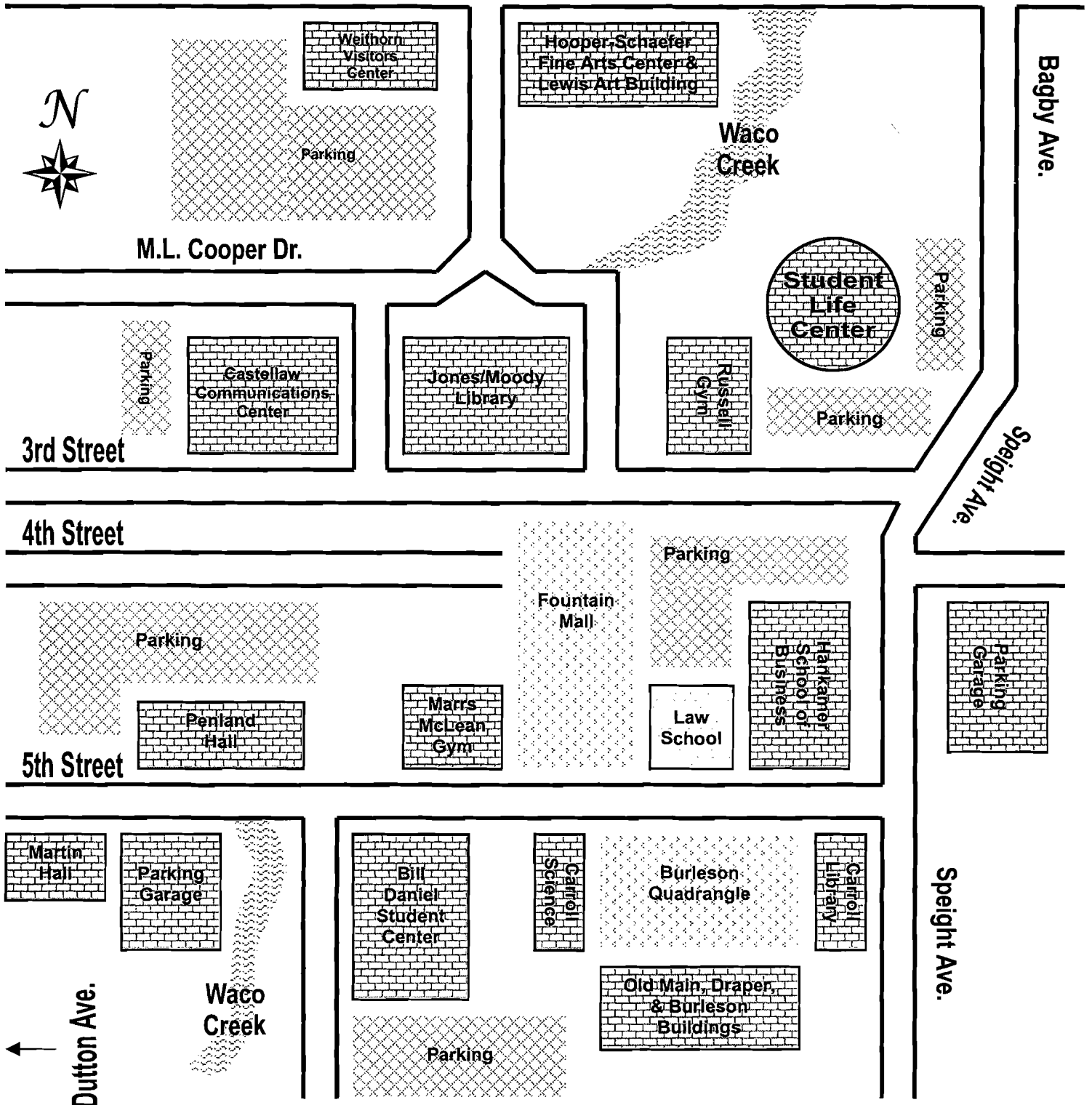
8. Badges

THE HISTORY OF THE NDT

The National Debate tournament began at the United States Military Academy in 1947. It was organized and conducted by the Academy at West Point for its first twenty years. Initial tournament rules were determined by the West Point Administration in consultation with debate coaches such as A. Craig Baird of the University of Iowa, G.M. Musgrave of Des Moines, Alan Nichols of USC, E.R. Nichols of the University of Redlands, and Joseph O'Brien of Pennsylvania State University.

At the first tournament in 1947, 29 colleges participated in five "seeding" rounds and four elimination rounds over a three-day period. Some of the features of the tournament were that no school would meet a school within five hundred miles of itself during the seeding rounds and that no coach would judge a school from his or her own district. Many traditions were started at West Point that year, some of which still remain today: the "big board", oral announcement of round pairing, cadet escorts for each team, teams for each debate meeting under the banner of the affirmative team, and team signs in the rooms.

In 1967, the National Debate Tournament entered a new era as the American Forensic Association, the national professional organization of forensics educators, assumed responsibility for the tournament. The NDT was moved from West Point and has been hosted by a different school every year since, although three schools (West Georgia, Miami University of Ohio, and the University of Utah) have hosted it twice. Procedures for the tournament are determined by the NDT Committee, which is composed of one member elected from each of the 9 districts and 4 members appointed by the AFA president. The NDT Board of Trustees is also appointed by the AFA president and it has the responsibility of overseeing all NDT financial matters. As debate has developed in recent years other refinements have been added to the tournament: cross examination, the 10 minute preparation time rule, elaborate procedures for assigning judges, judge qualifications and computer-assisted research stations for participating schools. Over the years, the tournament has expanded in size to a maximum of 78 teams.

In the early days, district-nominating committees chose teams. This method was replaced by some form of qualifying tournament in most districts. For the first 20 years of NDT competition the tournament host and previous year's winner received automatic invitations. Post-district at-large bids were initiated in 1968, and pre-district bids in 1971. Since 1970, it has been possible for a school to qualify as many as two teams for the NDT. Beginning in 1992, up to six schools can qualify a third team.

The National Debate Tournament is grateful to its corporate sponsor, the Ford Motor Company Fund. The NDT is also indebted to Mr. Sigurd S. Larmon (1891-1987) for donating the rotating Larmon Trophy, emblematic of the national debate championship; to Mr. and Mrs. George Walker for donating the rotating second-place Walker Memorial Trophy in memory of their son; to Mr. Robert Feldhake, top speaker at the 1976 NDT and now an attorney in Los Angeles for donating the Wayne Brockriede Top Speaker Award; to District IX for donating the rotating top Speaker Trophy; the Copeland Family for donating the Rex Copeland First Team At-Large Trophy; and to Ovid R. Davis and the State University of West Georgia College for donating the Championship Coach Award.
