

## **Pre-Architecture programs**

Pre-Architecture programs are designed for undergraduate students who are not currently enrolled in a professional architecture program, but who wish to learn more about the practice of architecture, architectural history, and graphics. These are rigorous programs, with studio experiences similar to that of professional architecture schools. They are good introductions to the practice for students who are considering enrolling in master of architecture programs.

### **Florence: Syracuse University**

Students take three pre-architecture program courses for six credits (Architectural Concepts, Architectural Freehand Drawing, and Architectural Analysis and Design), an art history course for three credits, and six credits of Italian language courses. Includes extensive site visit and study tour to cities like Rome, Mantua, or Venice). Offered in the Fall and Spring semesters.

### **Copenhagen, Denmark: DIS**

The Pre-Architecture program is designed for students in liberal arts universities, with limited prior experience in architectural design or drafting. In the semester-long program (Fall or Spring), students take a six hour Architecture Foundations Studio, 20<sup>th</sup> Century Danish Architecture, and one other Architecture and Design course, along with a language or humanities course. In the five-week summer Pre-Architecture program, student take Architecture Foundations Studio and Scandinavian Architecture and Design for a total of six hours of credit.
