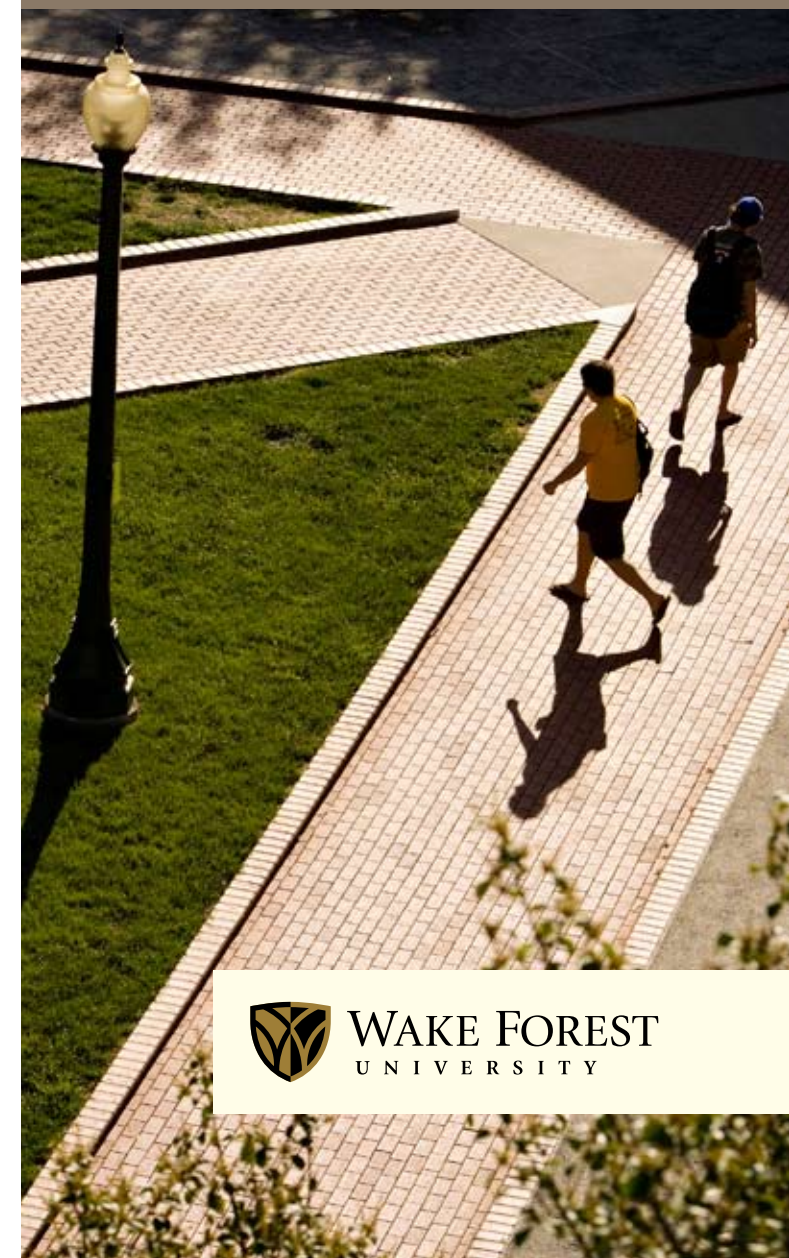

The Office of Career Services offers a number of programs and services for students who are exploring their career options or seeking a job or internship.

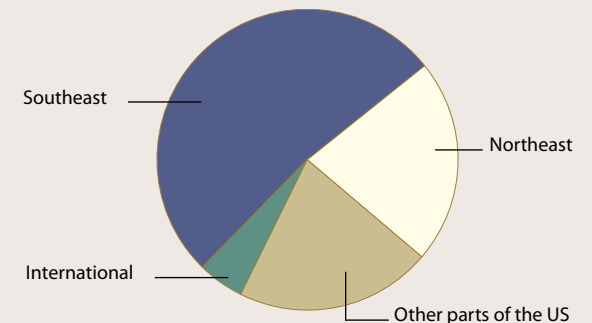
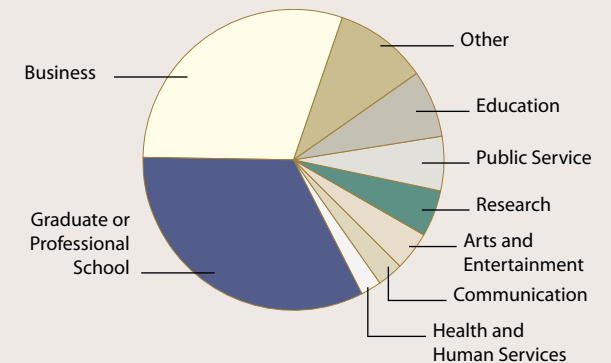
- Individual counseling

- ECHO (Explore Career Happenings Online)—Our central hub for job and internship postings and on-campus recruiting schedules where students can learn about opportunities, employers recruiting on campus and upcoming career-oriented events. Students must register with the Office of Career Services to gain access.
- Campus interviews—Recruiters from business, industry, governmental and non-profit agencies and public/private schools conduct interviews for entry-level positions
