

Party Management Enforcement

What behaviors or conditions can result in the close down of a social function?

1. Non-compliance with University Safety Standards and Regulations:
 - Fire hazards-combustible materials, exposed wiring, pyrotechnics
 - Overcrowding in excess of occupancy load requirements
2. Non-compliance or gross negligence with Party Management procedures:
 - Party Host not present or drinking
 - Underage students being served and/or drinking alcohol
 - Failure to take appropriate corrective action when notified of a potential violation
 - Failure to adhere to B.Y.O.B. guidelines
3. Harassment of University Officials or other students:
 - Verbal or physical abuse towards residence life staff, Compliance Advisers, University Police or other students.

What behaviors or conditions can result in administrative penalties for future social functions?

1. Poor party management practices:
 - Lack of proper access control at front or back doors
 - Open containers of alcohol leaving the function
 - Individuals standing on patio walls
 - Improper monitoring of guest logs
 - Failure to close down the party on time
 - Inadequate clean up of party activities
2. Improper registration of social functions:
 - Inaccurate information on party registration

Any violation of the University Alcohol Policy may be referred directly to the Associate Vice President for Student Life/Dean of Student Services for judicial action and/or administrative action may be taken by the Director of Greek Life and the Coordinator of Greek Life.
