## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Dept. of Romance Languages at Wake Forest offers a six-week Italian course in Italy. Participants reside at Casa Artom on the Grand Canal in Venice, where they will share rooms with other students. This luxurious house has a laundry facility and a large kitchen where students can prepare their own meals. Casa Artom is conveniently located, close to the Academia Bridge, the Guggenheim Museum, churches, restaurants, coffeehouses and small grocery stores. Every weekend the class goes on a field trip to cities like Verona, Padua, Florence, Siena, and others, visiting museums, sites of cultural interest, and doing other cultural activities. Other activities are done in Venice, including a cooking lesson and a night at the opera.

## CURRICULUM

**113V. Intensive Elementary Italian in an Immersion Setting.** (8h) A six week intensive course in Italian, taught during the summer in Venice, Italy, designed for students with a maximum of one semester of previous study in Italian. Classes meet five hours daily and cover speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Special activities include day-trips to sites of cultural interest. Students wishing to register must complete an application early in the preceding spring semester in the Department of Romance Languages and be admitted to the course. Credit not given for both Italian 113V and 112. However, a grade of B or above will grant admission to Italian 215, without the need to complete Italian 153 in order to satisfy the language requirement.



## PROGRAM COST

The cost for this program is \$6,600. It includes tuition (for 8 credit hours); lodging in Venice and Florence; administrative fees; all field trips and excursions included in the program; the cost of one group dinner at Casa Artom; eight museum visits; transportation for day trips to Murano, Burano, Torcello, Verona, Padova, Pisa, Siena, San Gimignano; one group dinner out in Venice; and the laundry facility in Venice. The cost does not include airfare to and from Italy; individual transportation from and to the airport; US fees for passports; course materials; meals other than above specified; personal expenses.

Full payment is due by March 31, 2009. Students should apply for a passport immediately. Students withdrawing after these dates will receive refunds according to Wake Forest policy.
