### **Key for Terminology as Referenced**

#### **Summary Action**

One-on-one adjudication with the judicial officer when a student is not contesting the charge(s) and it is unnecessary to call witnesses. The student is given the option to avail themselves of student advisor assistance as part of this process.

#### **Administrative Hearing**

Formal hearing with the judicial officer or hearing panel to adjudicate cases involving social (non-academic) violations.

#### **Community Infraction**

Cases that are processed by the Judicial Administrator when a student assumes responsibility for a first time underage possession or public display violation.

#### **Alternative Sanction**

A student is treated for medical issues related to an alcohol violation and no other behavioral issues are involved, is eligible for a no judicial record situation, on the first offense only, and only if no future violations occur.

**Administrative Group Hearings**

A student group is charged with a violation and heard by the judicial officer.

**Group Advisory Panel Hearings**

A student group is charged with serious violations of group behavior where the judicial officer chooses to utilize a panel, which may be composed of students, faculty and staff.

**HEC Hearings**

A board of seven members (2 faculty, 1 administrator and 4 students) hear cases involving academic honor violations.

**Hearing Practice Cases**

Felony cases, including sexual assault, heard by a hearing officer, with or without a panel.

**Adjudications**

Any one of the judicial proceedings as categorized above.

**Appeals**

Heard by the Judicial Council (panel of faculty, administrators and students), and based on at least one (1) of three (3) reasons as cited in the Student Code of Conduct.

**Academic Honor**

Violations of the Wake Forest Honor Code in an academic setting and heard by the Honor and Ethics Council (HEC).

**Social Honor**

Non-academic cases involving lying, cheating and stealing in a social situation and heard by the judicial officer in an administrative hearing.

**Underage**

Students in possession of or using alcohol under 21 years of age, on or off campus.

**Alcohol Abuse**

Students using alcohol to a degree that renders them physically incapable of caring for themselves, making decisions, needing medical intervention, or otherwise endangering themselves or others.

**Aiding and Abetting**

Students providing alcohol (or the location to consume alcohol) to underage individuals. The student who is involved in aiding and abetting may or may not be 21 years of age himself (herself).

**DWI**

Driving under the influence of alcohol or another controlled substance.

**Public Display**

Having an open container of alcohol in an unapproved location (outside of one's residence if 21 or a registered event).

**Purchase or Attempt to Purchase**

Purchase or attempting to purchase alcohol by someone under 21 years of age, with or without use of a false id.

**Sexual Misconduct**

Includes rape, sexual assault, sexual exploitation, stalking, cyber stalking, sexual harassment and any type of unwanted sexual activity.
