Boot Camp is held on the Timberline Campus of Colorado Mountain College in the mountains near Leadville, Colorado. Leadville was incorporated in 1878 and, at 10,152 feet, is the highest incorporated city in the continental United States. The town of Leadville has a National Historic Landmark District encompassing over 70 square blocks, with most of its buildings built in the Victorian style between 1880–1905.
