## **Course Narrative**

In this photography class you will be introduced to new technical processes and critical approaches to photography that will build upon your current knowledge of the art form. You will learn greater control over exposing and developing negatives as well as mastering the b/w print. You will be introduced to medium and large format cameras, alternative photographic techniques, the light meter, studio lighting, and flash photography. Emphasis will be placed upon the understanding and use of the elements of design and visual communication within the two-dimensional picture plane. Technical information serves the goal of understanding contemporary aesthetic and critical issues.

The course will be structured around the sequence of lectures/demonstrations, assignment, lab and critique, in a three to for week cycle. In other words, you will be given a lecture on a specific topic. During that class an assignment sheet will be handed out. The following class or two will be used as labs and lectures to work on the assignment. Then we will critique those images as a group and start the process again.

## **Grading and Attendance Policy**

Your grade will be based upon the grades you receive on each visual assignments as well as your thoughtful participation in critiques and discussions of assigned reading.

Critique: an act of criticizing; a critical estimate or discussion

Critical: exercising or involving careful judgment or judicious evaluation

Not to be confused with: **Dissing, Dogging, Slamming, badgering, hassling...** 

We will be covering a number of techniques and issues in this class. Your attendance and punctuality is crucial to our success as a class and to you as a student. You may miss <u>one</u> class period without excuse. Each absence thereafter will reduce your semester grade by one letter. Two late marks count as one absence.
